



## Notice of Action

### Adoption of the 2010 King County Open Space Plan: Parks, Trails and Natural Areas

Notice is hereby given under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) (RCW 43.21C.080 and WAC 197-11-990) that the King County Council, took the action described in (2) below on June 14, 2010. This action is not subject to administrative review.

**1. Notice of Action:** Any action to set aside, enjoin, review, or otherwise challenge such action on the grounds of non-compliance with the provisions of Chapter 43.21C RCW (SEPA) shall be commenced on or before Thursday, July 27, 2010, which is 21 days after the last publication of this Notice of Action (NOA). Said NOA will be published on the same day of each week for two consecutive weeks in a legal newspaper of general circulation in King County (RCW 43.21C.080(1)(a)). This NOA will also be filed with the Washington State Department of Ecology at its main office in Olympia prior to the date of last newspaper publication (RCW 43.21C.080(1)(b)).

**2. Description of agency action:** On June 14, 2010, the King County Council adopted the 2010 King County Open Space Plan: Parks, Trails and Natural Areas

**3. Description of proposal:** The proposal is for an update of the King County Parks Comprehensive Plan (2004 King County Open Space System Plan: Parks, Trails, Natural Areas and Working Resource Lands), which was adopted by the King County Council on July 19, 2004. The 2010 King County Open Space Plan: Parks, Trails and Natural Areas is a functional plan, which provides the policy framework for the county's acquisition, development, stewardship, management and funding of the open space system. The intent of the plan is to provide responsible stewardship for King County's open space resources, focusing on environmental protection, recreational opportunities, and improved ways of generating revenue and reducing costs. While the plan itself does not include site-specific recommendations, implementation of policies at a later date may include projects needing permits and approvals, which would require additional environmental review under SEPA and/or NEPA.

**4. Location of proposal:** King County (this programmatic plan does not include location-specific recommendations).


**5. Type of environmental review under SEPA:** A Determination of Non-Significance was published and opened for review and public comment from April 8 through April 22, 2010.
