Dow Constantine, King County Executive

King County Executive Dow Constantine was sworn in as King County Executive on November 24, 2009. He served as a King County Council member for eight years, and has held elected office in Washington State for 13 years. Stone Gossard, Sustainability advocate and Pearl Jam rhythm guitarist

Stone Carpenter Gossard (born July 20, 1966 in Seattle, Washington) is an American musician who serves as the rhythm guitarist for the American rock band Pearl Jam. Along with Jeff Ament, Mike McCready, and Eddie Vedder, he is one of the founding members of Pearl Jam. Gossard is also known for his work prior to Pearl Jam with the 1980s Seattle, Washington-based grunge rock bands Green River and Mother Love Bone, and he has made contributions to the music industry as a producer and owner of a record label and a recording studio. Gossard has also been a member of the side project band Brad. In 2001, Gossard released his first solo album, Bayleaf.



Kevin Brown, Division Director, King County Parks

Kevin Brown is Division Director of the Parks and Recreation Division of the King County Department of Natural Resources and Parks, which stewards 200 parks, 175 miles of trails, and 26,000 acres of open space. He has served as Director since 2005, successfully navigating the division through the challenging economic climate. Prior to his tenure as director, Kevin spent ten years with the Division managing capital planning and land management functions, such as developing the annual capital budget and managing and developing lease, contract and concession agreements.



Chris Toher, Executive Vice President and General Manager, Skanska

Chris Toher is general manager of Skanska USA Building in Seattle. Over the past 25 years, he has had a hand in some of the region's landmark projects, including the recent Bertschi School science wing, which is slated to be the state's first Living Building.

Over the course of his 30-year career, photographer Wolfe has worked on every continent and in hundreds of locations. His stunning images interpret and record the world's fast-disappearing wildlife, landscapes and native cultures, and are a lasting inspiration to those who seek to preserve them all. Wolfe's photographs are recognized throughout the world for their mastery of color, composition and perspective. Wolfe's photographic mission is multi-faceted: art, wildlife advocacy, journalism inform his work. Wolfe has released over sixty books, including the award-winning *Vanishing Act* and *Edge of the Earth* *Corner of the Sky*.

Eric Corey Freed is Principal of organicARCHITECT architecture and consulting firm in California, with nearly 20 years of experience in green building. Eric co-developed the Sustainable Design programs at the Academy of Art University and University of California Berkeley Extension.
