21. Due to King County's budget challenges, the Parks Division has not been fully funded for nearly a decade and now has a maintenance backlog estimated at 50 million dollars. Without future funding, some facilities, such as trail bridges, play structures, and historic buildings, could be closed for safety reasons. King County parks could invest in reducing this maintenance backlog.

22. King County has protected thousands of acres of forests, wetlands, and salmon habitat. King County Parks could continue acquiring natural areas that protect water quality and wildlife.

23. King County currently has a network of 175 miles of regional trails. King County could invest in upgrading existing trails, improving trail safety, and adding missing links to the existing network, such as to the Green River Trail and Cedar River Trail, giving people more ways to get around without a car and more access to exercise.

24. King County Parks carries out routine park maintenance, which involves cleaning restrooms, mowing fields, repairing trails, and removing nonnative plants, but due to budget cutbacks the park maintenance schedule has been significantly reduced. The county could return the maintenance schedule to its original frequency.

25. King County parks could invest in more funding for park systems in the 39 cities in the County so they could build and improve recreation facilities like ball fields, playgrounds, and trails.

26. King County could develop a new major trail on the eastside on what was once the BNSF train line. This trail would connect Woodinville, Kirkland, Redmond, Bellevue, and Renton, and could become to the eastside what the Burke-Gilman is to the Seattle area.

27. King County could work with five south King County cities to develop a new major trail that connects Lake Washington in Renton to Puget Sound in Des Moines. The trail would give more people ways to get to business and shopping districts and transit hubs without a car and provide more ways to get exercise.

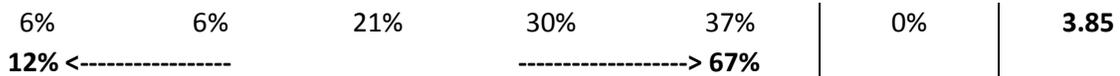

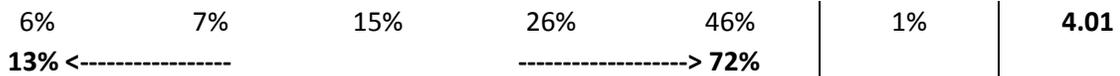
To date, King County has made no decisions about funding parks and trails in the future, but many options are being considered on how best to fund these activities.

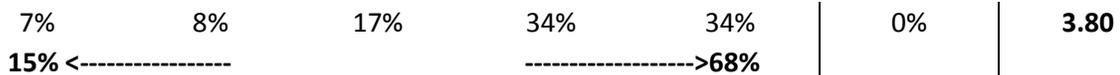
