Notice of Action

Forest Practices on King County Parks lands permitted as Class 4G non-conversion actions

Notice is hereby given under SEPA, RCW 43.21C.080, that the Parks and Recreation Division, King County Department of Natural Resources and Parks, took the action described in item 2 below on April 5, 2011.

1. Any action to set aside, enjoin, review, or otherwise challenge such action on the grounds of non-compliance with the provisions of Chapter 43.21C RCW shall be commenced on or before May 4, 2011.
2. The agency decision is to proceed on Forest Practice Permit review in accordance with this Forest Practices (non-conversion Class 4G) on King County Parks multi-project SEPA.
3. This multi-project SEPA covers the all forest practices on King County Parks lands permitted as Class 4G non-conversion actions by King County DDES. These activities are classified as "Class 4G" under the Forest Practices Act because they are occurring on parcels platted after 1960 (requiring SEPA and review by the local permit agency); "non-conversion" means the land will remain in long-term forest/open space use.
4. A Determination of Non-Significance was published and opened for review and public comment from February 25, 2011 through March 11, 2011. The projects covered by this action will be undertaken by King County Department of Natural Resources and Parks; work will be done by two divisions within DNRP: The Parks Division and the Water and Land Resources Division (WLRD). King County's WLRD Forestry Program provides technical assistance to the Parks Division and will work with the Parks Division to develop the forest stewardship plan and the proposals for specific forest practices required to implement the plan. WLRD will be the applicant for the permit and will develop the contract specifications for the harvest.

6. A Decision to Proceed was signed on April 5, 2011 by Kevin Brown, King County Parks and Recreation Division Director. This Notice of Action was filed on April 6, 2011 and will continue in effect through May 4, 2011.
