





- 2 Download the Flood Warning App** – Real-time river gage info to help you track Cedar River flood conditions right on your smart phone.
- 3 Follow King County Rivers on Facebook** – Get the latest news about King County Rivers.
- 4 Know your flood hazard** – Look up your property on iMap on the County website or visit floodmart.gov.
- 5 Get flood preparedness tips** – Info for before, during and after a flood, including sandbag resources, emergency contacts and flood phases.
