Discuss approach to remaining meetings for producing overall recommendations (short term actions, guiding principles or specific guidance).
Discuss "Buffer" issue and begin to identify potential solutions.

Discuss Buffer Issue and begin discussing the details of the Drainage issues and generate potential solutions.
- Mar. 12 Advisory Committee meeting #7
Discuss Drainage issues and large restoration projects (CIP) and flood reduction projects in the APD. Discuss specific Snoqualmie at Fall City (SAFC) habitat restoration and flood risk reduction projects . Committee generates potential solutions.
- Mar. 26 Advisory Committee meeting #8
Discuss large restoration projects recommendations. Initial presentation and discussion of opportunities and solutions for reducing flood impacts (suggestions beyond CIP projects).
- April 9 Advisory Committee meeting #9

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Discuss recommendations for reducing other flood impacts (suggestions beyond CIP projects). Presentation and discussion of opportunities and solutions for reducing flood impacts (beyond CIP projects).

□ April 23 Advisory Committee meeting #10

Discuss large restoration projects recommendations. Input on the general description of what success looks like for Snoqualmie Farmers, Flood Risk Reduction and Fish Habitat Restoration efforts.

Milestones:

Specific Recommendations, Evaluate Impact

Discussion of all committee generated recommendations and the impact of those on FFF. Input on recommendations and the status of suggestions moving forward. If needed the committee may re-balance strategies, actions, or sequencing of recommendations, if needed. Review potential solutions and recommendations (both short or long term actions). Confirm description and clarification of initial recommendations.

□ May 28 Advisory Committee meeting #12 (4:30-7:30PM) *

Review drafts of committee recommendations including next steps and articulation of the areas where the groups agree that they have not arrived at a consensus recommendation.

Milestones:

- *Specific recommendations and agreement on documentation of committee recommendations, for the near term and long term.*
- *General description of what success looks like for the Farmers, Flood Risk Reduction and Fish Habitat Restoration efforts in the Snoqualmie*

Other Public Engagement Activities:

Throughout this timeframe there will be briefings on progress and approaches to other stakeholder organizations. At a minimum this includes:

- a. Snoqualmie Forum, King County Flood Control District, Agriculture Commission. May also include Fall City Parks District, Mountains to Sound Greenway Trust, Sno-Valley Tilth and other community groups.
- b. Periodically (and regularly) "Ag/Farm Sounding Board" meetings will be held for the North APD and the South APD.
- c. Snoqualmie Watershed public input workshop later in the 6-month timeframe (early to mid April 2014) to share strategies and get input.
