NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on Tuesday, November 4, 2008, in King County, State of Washington, at the polling places listed separately, there will be held a General Election for the purpose of electing candidates for the offices listed below and Special Elections for submitting to the voters for their approval or rejection the ballot measures as listed. The names and addresses of candidates and the offices for which they have been nominated are listed below.

Washington has a new election system

In each race for partisan office, the two candidates who received the most votes in the August primary advance to the November general election.

Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

The election for president and vice-president is different. Candidates for president and vice-president are the official nominees of their political party.
