Part of West Snoqualmie Valley Road NE will close to through traffic during construction

First of two closures will begin this September

King County will close West Snoqualmie Valley Road NE between NE 80th Street and Ames Lake-Carnation Road NE to through traffic in order to rebuild a deteriorated stretch of roadway. Poor drainage in the area has contributed to degradation of the road. This section of road has been patched before; now it's time for a full reconstruction. This project will:


- Replace a short-span bridge
- Install six box culverts
- Enlarge five drainage crossings
- Reconstruct the roadway

To protect fish in and near the project area, construction will be done in two phases (see schedule below). A detour route will be posted at each end of the project limit. Residents, property owners, and emergency vehicles will still have access to homes and properties during the closures.

Construction impacts

During construction, expect increased truck traffic in the area as the contractor brings in equipment and materials. There may also be increased noise during daytime working hours.

The county is working with school districts,



emergency responders, and others who might be affected by the closures to help them prepare.
