In accordance with Chapter 39.34 RCW, King County and the Duwamish Transportation Management Association agree to a cooperative governmental purchasing agreement for various equipment and supplies using King County's competitively awarded contracts.

King County therefore extends the use of its contracts to the Duwamish Transportation Management Association to the extent provided by law and upon the following terms:

- (1) The vendor(s) agree to extend to the Duwamish Transportation Association the terms and conditions of King County's contract(s).
- (2) Duwamish Transportation Management Association accepts responsibility for compliance with any additional or varying laws and regulations governing its purchases. Any purchases by the Duwamish Transportation Management Association shall be effected by a purchase order from the Duwamish Transportation Management Association and directed to the vendor.
- (3) King County accepts no responsibility for the performance of any of the purchasing contracts by the vendor.
- (4) King County accepts no responsibility for payment of the purchase price by the Duwamish Transportation Management Association.

This agreement may be revoked at any time in writing by either party.
