

- SWAC previewed state legislative issues for 2013, heard an Emergency Planning update, and received a presentation on converting non-recyclable plastics to fuel which is scheduled for the January MSWMAC meeting.

ILAs

Members heard a [presentation](#) about the content of the ILA. They also received a [briefing packet](#). City action on the amended and restated ILAs is anticipated to occur early in 2013.

King County needs to refinance the debt covered by Bond Anticipation Notes (BANs) which are coming due at the end of February 2013. Additional debt financing will also be needed later in 2013/2014 based on the current capital improvement plan. Financing terms will be influenced by the number of cities (tonnage) that elect to participate in the longer horizon ILA which extends to 2040 versus the current 2028.

South County Recycling and Transfer Station Siting Process

Thirty five comments were received during the SEPA public comment period. Environmental themes included traffic congestion and the slope next to the Algona property. A structural analysis is being done of the existing Algona Transfer Station and will be completed in early 2013.

The Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) will evaluate two action alternatives and a no action alternative and is expected to be completed in 2014. In addition to the EIS, King County will analyze the economic effects of a station as well as review Equity and Social Justice issues. More information about the project is available [here](#).
