June 24-26th is the King County Local Hazardous Waste Management Program Wastemobile Collection from 10a.m. to 5 p.m. at Tolt Middle School.

You can take Household Hazardous Wastes such as pesticides, paints, propane



or

tanks (20" x 30" max), glues and adhesives, thinners and solvents, aerosols, fluorescent light bulbs, toxic cleaning products, automotive products such as brake fluid and antifreeze, and hobby chemicals to the Wastemobile. For ¼ can less of latex paint, dry it out and put the can in the garbage. Please do not take Cleanup Day materials to the Wastemobile.

Here's What You Can Bring

Special Recycling Collection at Tolt Middle School

Saturday, May 21, 2005 9 AM to 3 PM (or until full)

(#'s match the locations on the layout diagram on the next panel.)
1. SIGN IN



2. Household Goods/Textiles

Furniture, sports equipment, tools, toys, books, miscellaneous household goods and clothing. Items must be reusable "as is." No items needing repair. If not accepted, you must take back. Tax receipts available.

3. Electronics

Electronics- laptops, monitors-\$10 Scanner, fax, cell phone, DVD, printer-\$5, Console TV-25\$, TV- \$20 Fluorescent Lights OK. 50 cents ea.

4. Refrigerators and Freezers

There is a **\$20 fee** for each freezer or refrigerator to safely remove the chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerants. Air Conditioners- \$35

5. Scrap Metal and Appliances

Stoves, washers, dryers, dishwashers, hot water tanks auto parts, aluminum chairs, lawn mowers, microwaves, copper pipe. **No** containers that held chemicals or hazardous fluids, **No** glass in doors or windows. **No** propane tanks or closed containers. **No** barbed wire.

6. Batteries

Car, truck, motorcycle, and marine lead acid batteries. Household alkaline flashlight batteries AAAA AAA B C D

7. Plastic Plant Pots & Peanuts

4 inch and larger plastic plant pots and black plant trays OK if not broken. Sort pots by size. Bring clean styrofoam packing peanuts in bags. **No** styrofoam packing frames. **No** plastic buckets, hoses, toys, pools, or other plastics.

8. Oil and Oil Filters

Used motor oil and oil filters. Please bring oil in a reusable container like a plastic milk jug or draitainer and take the container home. Do not mix used oil with antifreeze, gasoline, solvents, kitty litter or other contaminants.



8. Antifreeze

Keep antifreeze separate.


9. Tires: \$1 each off-rim; \$2 on.

Passenger, light truck, motorcycle tires 18" or less. Bias, steel belted, or studded are OK. Truck Tire \$8, Truck with Rim- \$15

Layout of Collection Stations at Tolt Middle School May 21st



1. Sign-in
2. Reusable Household Donations and Clothes
3. Electronics
4. Refrigerators and Freezers
5. Scrap Metal & Appliances
6. Vehicle/ Household Batteries
7. Plant Pots/Bags of Peanuts
8. Used Oil, Oil Filters, Antifreeze
9. Tires

Please pack your load in reverse order according to the setup of collection stations shown on the map above. Load the materials for the higher-numbered stations into the front of your vehicle. This will make it easier to unload the low numbers first. Thanks!

We reserve the right to refuse oversize, commercial, contaminated or unacceptable loads. Please, no dump trucks or flat beds.

Please DO NOT bring to Cleanup:

- ◆ Construction/Demolition Debris
- ◆ Yardwaste or Wood
- ◆ Household Hazardous Waste
- ◆ Bulky garbage

Household Hazardous Waste will be collected at the Wastemobile on June 24-26 from 10am - 5pm
