


## Location Map

# Recycling Collection Event Saturday, October 11, 2008 - 9am to 3pm - Houghton Park & Ride NE 70th St & 116th Ave NE



Items must meet the following guidelines. Some user fees apply to cover the cost of proper processing and recycling. All items collected will be recycled.

## You can bring....

- **TIRES:** Bias ply, steel belted, and studded tires accepted. Limit 4 passenger tires per household (18 inches and below) free of charge. No tires on rims, large truck tires, or oversized tires accepted.
- **MOTOR OIL, FILTERS, & ANTIFREEZE:** Motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, brake fluid, transmission fluid, 2-cycle oil, steering fluid, crankcase oil, kerosene, and home heating fuel. Do not mix with antifreeze, solvents, gasoline, or other substances.
- **LEAD ACID BATTERIES:** Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle batteries accepted.
- **ALKALINE BATTERIES:** AAAA, AAA, AA, A, B, C, and D cell batteries only.
- **CARDBOARD:** Please flatten. No wax coated cardboard.
- **HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND CLOTHING:** Includes clothing and miscellaneous household items in saleable condition. Mattresses will not be accepted. Furniture, couches, and items in need of repair will not be accepted.
- **PORCELAIN TOILETS AND SINKS:** Toilet seats, hardware, and base wax rings must be removed. **\$5.00 fee (cash only).**
- **PROPANE TANKS:** Empty residential tanks only. **\$5.00 fee (cash only).** Small empty camping stove tanks accepted for **\$1.00 fee (cash only).**
- **TELEVISION SETS:** TV sets with 36 inch or smaller screens and encased in plastic - **\$20 fee (cash only).** TV sets with larger than 36 inch screens, wood console, sets encased in wood, and big screen TV sets - **\$25 fee (cash only).** Projection TV sets - **\$30 fee (cash only).**
- **ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT:** Computers, printers, mouse, keyboards, fax machines, scanners, VCRs, DVD players and cell phones. Computer monitors will be collected for a **\$10 fee (cash only).** **Electronic equipment is collected at the curb free of charge for Kirkland single family residents only.** Please contact Waste Management at (800) 592-9995 or [kirklandinfo@wmnorthwest.com](mailto:kirklandinfo@wmnorthwest.com) at least one full day before your normal collection day to schedule pick-up of electronics.

- **SCRAP METAL & APPLIANCES:** Auto parts, engines and gas lawn mowers (drained of gas and oil), appliances, metal lawn chairs, stoves, barbecues, iron, steel, aluminum, brass, copper and other ferrous and nonferrous metals. **\$5 fee for each water heater that still has insulation coating (cash only).** Metals that are insulated, rubber or oil coated, previously or currently contain chemicals, paint, or hazardous materials will not be accepted. Light fixture ballasts and sealed drums will not be accepted.
- **REFRIGERATORS/FREEZERS/HOUSEHOLD AIR CONDITIONERS:** There is a fee for each of these items. **\$25 fee (cash only).**
- **FLUORESCENT LIGHT COLLECTION:** Fluorescent tubes and bulbs, incandescent bulbs. **Limit 10 tubes/bulbs per participant.** Not accepted: Broken lights and light fixture ballasts.

## NEW! Electronics Recycling Law in 2009

Effective January 1, 2009, a new product stewardship law in Washington will require manufacturers to provide electronics recycling services at no cost to households, small businesses, charities, school districts, and small governments. At least one collection site will be established in Kirkland (location yet to be determined) and at least one site will be available in each county. The only electronic items included in the new program are televisions, desktop and laptop computers, and monitors. Not included in the program are other electronics such as cell phones, printers, scanners, fax machines, or other electronics devices.

## Don't Bring these Household Products:

- No wood and yard debris
- No construction/demolition debris
- No garbage
- No mattresses/furniture/couches
- No plastic toys, hoses, etc.
- No window glass
- No painted wood



## Don't Bring these Household Hazardous Wastes:

- No paint
- No pesticides/herbicides
- No solvents and thinners
- No household chemicals
- No cleaning products



## The Factoria Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Site

Household hazardous wastes can be taken to the Household Hazardous Wastemobile or household hazardous waste collection sites in Seattle and Bellevue (Factoria). The Factoria Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Site is located at 13800 SE 32nd Street, Bellevue. The site is open 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., Tuesday through Sunday (except holidays). There is a 30 gallon limit per customer per day and customers will not get their containers back. No containers can be over five gallons in size.
