IMPORTANT DIRECTIONS FOR LOADING YOUR VEHICLE!

**LAYER YARD DEBRIS BY
PLACING A TARP IN THE BED OF THE
VEHICLE, LAYER DEBRIS. PLACE
ANOTHER TARP AND A LAYER OF
DEBRIS. EACH TARP CAN THEN BE
MORE EASILY REMOVED.**

BUNDLE, BAG, BOX, CONTAIN OR LAYER DEBRIS

LIMIT 3 VEHICLE LOADS PER HOUSEHOLD

- ◆ **No commercial loads**
- ◆ **No rocks, sod or dirt**
- ◆ **No branches larger than
4 inches wide by 8 feet long**

SECURE YOUR LOAD & Register Trailers Too!

According to the Washington State
Department of Transportation, road
debris causes about 350 accidents
every year on state highways.

Even if you are going a short
distance and not driving on a highway,
you are still required by law to
secure your load.

The fine for transporting an
unsecured load is \$216. If an item falls
off a vehicle and causes bodily harm,
the driver faces gross
misdemeanor charges and penalties of
up to \$5000 and/or up to a year in
prison.

What can you do? Follow these tips for securing your load:

- ◆ Tie Down - Tie your load with rope,
bungee cords, netting or straps. Tie
large items directly to your vehicle.
- ◆ Don't Overload - Keep material level
with the truck bed or trailer unless
tied down, netted, or tarped.
- ◆ Lighter Goes Lower - Put lighter
weight things at the bottom of the
load.
- ◆ Consider Covering - Cover your load
with a secured tarp or net.
- ◆ Always Double-Check - Make sure
your load is secured.
