


Location Map

Recycling Collection Event Saturday, April 25, 2009 - 9am to 3pm - Houghton Park & Ride NE 70th St & 116th Ave NE



You can bring....

- **TIRES:** Bias ply, steel belted, and studded tires accepted. Limit 4 passenger tires per household (18 inches and below) free of charge. No tires on rims, large truck tires, or oversized tires accepted.
- **BULKY WOOD:** Tree branches (minimum 6 inches in diameter), logs, clean plywood, pallets, and other untreated and unpainted wood. No particle or press board. No leaves, grass, small branches, sod, brush, painted or stained wood. Please lay a tarp under material for easy removal.
- **MOTOR OIL, FILTERS, & ANTIFREEZE:** Motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, brake fluid, transmission fluid, 2-cycle oil, steering fluid, crankcase oil, kerosene, and home heating fuel. Do not mix with antifreeze, solvents, gasoline, or other substances.
- **LEAD ACID BATTERIES:** Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle batteries accepted.
- **ALKALINE BATTERIES:** AAAA, AAA, AA, A, B, C, and D cell batteries only.
- **CARDBOARD:** Please flatten. No wax coated cardboard.
- **HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND CLOTHING:** Includes clothing and miscellaneous household items in saleable condition. Mattresses will not be accepted. Furniture, couches, and items in need of repair will not be accepted.
- **PORCELAIN TOILETS AND SINKS:** Toilet seats, hardware, and base wax rings must be removed. **\$5.00 fee (cash only).**
- **PROPANE TANKS:** Empty residential tanks only. **\$5.00 fee (cash only).** Small empty camping stove tanks accepted for **\$1.00 fee (cash only).**
- **ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT:** Printers, mouse, keyboards, fax machines, scanners, VCRs, DVD players and cell phones. **Electronic equipment is collected at the curb free of charge for Kirkland single family (house) residents only.** Please contact Waste Management at (800) 592-9995 or on-line at www.wmnorthwest.com/kirkland at least one day before your regular collection day.
- **REFRIGERATORS/FREEZERS/HOUSEHOLD AIR CONDITIONERS:** There is a fee for each of these items. **\$25 fee (cash only).**
- **FLUORESCENT LIGHT COLLECTION:** Fluorescent tubes and bulbs, incandescent bulbs. **Limit 10 tubes/bulbs per participant.** Not accepted: Broken lights and light fixture ballasts.

Items must meet the prescribed guidelines. Some user fees apply to cover the cost of proper processing and recycling. All items collected will be recycled.

IMPORTANT NOTICE!

Due to the overwhelming success and convenience of the new E-Cycle Washington Program, we will no longer accept televisions, desktop and laptop computers, and computer monitors at our biannual Kirkland residential recycling collection events.

We will still continue to accept all other electronic items at our event including cell phones, printers, scanners, fax machines, mice, and keyboards.

Single family (house) residents can still recycle their electronic items at the curb by calling Waste Management Customer Service at (800) 592-9995 at least one day before your regular garbage day.

REMEMBER: The only electronic items included in the E-Cycle Washington program are televisions, desktop and laptop computers and computer monitors. Other electronic items such as cell phones, printers, fax machines, mice, keyboards, DVD/VCR players, and other electronics devices are still collected at Kirkland Recycling Collection Events and at the curb for single family (house) Kirkland residents.

Don't Bring these Household Products:

- No scrap metal or appliances
- No construction/demolition debris
- No garbage
- No mattresses/furniture/couches
- No plastic toys, hoses, etc.
- No window glass
- No painted wood



Don't Bring these Household Hazardous Wastes:

- No oil-based paint
- No pesticides/herbicides
- No solvents and thinners
- No household chemicals
- No cleaning products



The Factoria Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Site

Household hazardous wastes can be taken to the Household Hazardous Wastemobile or household hazardous waste collection sites in Seattle and Bellevue (Factoria). No latex paint is collected at these sites. The Factoria Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Site is located at 13800 SE 32nd Street, Bellevue. The site is open 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., Tuesday through Sunday (except holidays). There is a 30 gallon limit per customer per day and customers will not get their containers back. No containers can be over five gallons in size.
