Latex paint is no longer considered hazardous waste and the household hazardous waste facilities in Seattle and King County no longer accept it. Residents who cannot use latex paint should dry it out with kitty litter and put it in the garbage with the lid off. Visit the King County website [www.kingcounty.gov/dnrp/swd](http://www.kingcounty.gov/dnrp/swd) for more information on how to dry out latex paint. There is a 50 gallon limit and a gasoline limit of 30 gallons per customer per day and customers will not get their containers back. No containers can be over five gallons in size.

## E-Cycle Washington

Washington now has a FREE recycling program called "E-Cycle Washington" for computers, computer monitors, laptops, and televisions. Call 1-800-RECYCLE or visit [1800recycle.wa.gov](http://1800recycle.wa.gov) to find authorized E-Cycle Washington collection locations.

In the SeaTac area you may drop off computers, computer monitors, laptops, and televisions at no charge at most Goodwill, Salvation Army, and St. Vincent de Paul stores. Please note – drop off locations and conditions may change. Computer peripherals such as keyboards, mice, and printers are not included in this program but will be accepted at SeaTac's Recycling Collection Events.

#### Why recycle electronics?

Many electronics, especially TVs and computers, contain toxic materials such as lead, cadmium and mercury. Reusing and recycling electronics keeps these toxic materials out of our landfills and incinerators and also recovers valuable resources.

The electronic equipment that the E-Cycle Washington program collects will be taken apart and separated into materials such as glass, plastic, metal and toxic chemicals. All recycling will follow performance standards set up by the Department of Ecology.

Shredding and recycling services for confidential papers. Limit 5 file-sized boxes.

**ALKALINE BATTERIES:** AAAA, AAA, AA, A, B, C, and D cell batteries only.

**LEAD ACID BATTERIES:** Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle batteries accepted.

**APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METAL:** Auto parts, engines and gas lawnmowers (drained of oil and gasoline), appliances, metal lawn chairs, stoves, microwaves, barbecues, iron, steel, aluminum, brass, copper and other ferrous and nonferrous metals. **\$5 will be charged for each water heater (cash only).** Metals that previously or currently contain chemicals, paint, or hazardous materials will not be accepted. Sealed drums will not be accepted.

**ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT:** DVD players, VCRs, stereo equipment, printers, copiers, fax machines, toner cartridges, scanners, cellular phones and computer peripherals such as keyboards and mice. **Computer monitors and televisions will not be accepted. You can recycle these items for free at other locations - see the E-Cycle box for more information.**

**MOTOR OIL, FILTERS, & ANTIFREEZE:** Motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, brake fluid, transmission fluid, 2-cycle oil, steering fluid, crankcase oil, kerosene, and home heating fuel. Do not mix with antifreeze, solvents, gasoline, or other substances.

**HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND CLOTHING:** Clothing and miscellaneous household items in good condition. Mattresses will not be accepted. Furniture and items in need of repair will not be accepted. Benefits Northwest Center.

**FLUORESCENT LIGHTS:** fluorescent tubes and bulbs, incandescent bulbs. Broken lights and light fixture ballasts will not be accepted. **Limit 10 per vehicle.**

**REFRIGERATORS/FREEZERS:** **\$25 will be charged for each refrigerator or freezer. \$25 will be charged for each household air conditioner (cash only).**

**TIRES:** Bias ply, steel belted, and studded tires accepted. **Limit 8 passenger tires per household (18 inches and below) free of charge. \$1.50 charge for each tire on a rim. \$5 charged for each large truck tire and \$15 charged for each truck tire on rim (cash only).**  
**No oversized tires accepted.**

**PROPANE TANKS:** Residential five gallon tanks only. **\$5 charge (cash only).**

**PORCELAIN TOILETS AND SINKS:** Toilet seats, hardware, and base wax rings must be removed. **\$5 charge (cash only).**
