

# Here's What You Can Bring

### 2. Plant Pots & Peanuts

4" and larger plastic plant pots and black plant trays OK if not broken. Sort pots by size. Remove soil.

**No plastic pails, chairs, pools, etc. No household or small plant pots.**

Bring clean styrofoam packing peanuts in bags.

**No styrofoam packing frames.**

### 3. Household Goods & Linens

Clothing, shoes, books, tools, toys, linens, radios, and miscellaneous household goods. **No furniture.**

Donations to Northwest Center charity. Items must be reusable "as is." **No items needing repair.** If not accepted, you must take back.

Tax receipts available.

### 4. Batteries

Car, truck, motorcycle, and marine lead-acid batteries.

**Household and flashlight batteries are welcome this year.**

### 5. Oil & Oil Filters

Used motor oil and oil filters. Please bring oil in a reusable container like a plastic milk jug or daintainer and take container home. Do not mix used oil with antifreeze, gasoline, solvents, kitty litter or other contaminants.

### 5. Antifreeze

Keep used antifreeze separate. Bring to the oil collection station.

### 6. TV's, Electronics & Fluorescent Light Bulbs

Equipment can be working or not working. Electronics will not be reconditioned or reused. They will be recycled as scrap metal. Commercial equipment will not be accepted.

Fees for each unit are:

All TVs - FREE

Computer CPU/Laptop - FREE

Computer Monitor - FREE

Microwave \$10

Small Copier \$10

Stereo - \$7

Cell phone/DVD/VCR/Printer - \$5

Scanner/Fax Machine - \$5

Telephone - \$3

Keyboard/Mouse/Circuit boards - FREE

**Fluorescent Light Bulbs - 50 Cents for each lamp.**

### 7. Tires: \$1 each off rim, \$2 on rim

Passenger, light truck, or motorcycle tires 18" or less. Bias, steel belted, or studded are OK. Extra for Split Rim. Call 425-788-1185 before collection day for prices of larger tires.

### 8. Refrigerated Appliances

There is a \$20 fee for each refrigerator or freezer to safely remove chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerants.

### 9. Scrap Metal & Appliances

Stoves, hot water tanks, washers, dryers, dishwashers, auto parts, aluminum chairs, mowers, cast iron sinks and tubs, iron and copper. Please remove any fluids, rubber, plastic, vinyl, wood, webbing and wheels.

**No glass in doors or windows. No balls of barbed wire. No fluorescent light fixture ballasts. No propane or closed tanks or containers. No containers that held chemicals or hazardous fluids.**

## Layout of Collection Stations at Holy Innocents Church July 31<sup>st</sup>

1. Sign-in
2. Plant Pots/Packing Peanuts
3. Reusable Household Goods/  
Clothing Donations
4. Batteries
5. Oil/Oil Filters/Antifreeze
6. TV's / Electronics / Fluorescent  
Light Bulbs(\$)
7. Tires (\$)
8. Refrigerators / Freezers (\$)
9. Scrap Metal / Appliances

Please pack your load in reverse order according to the setup of the collection stations shown on the map above.

Load the materials for the higher-numbered stations into the front of your vehicle. This will make it easier to unload the low numbers first. Thanks!

*We reserve the right to refuse oversize, commercial, contaminated or unacceptable loads.  
Please, no dump trucks or flat beds.*

## Please do not bring to Cleanup Day at Holy Innocents Church

- NO** Construction/Demolition Debris.
- NO** Plastics (except plant pots).
- NO** Yardwaste or Wood.
- NO** Household Hazardous Wastes.

You can take Household Hazardous Wastes such as pesticides, oil-based paints, propane tanks, glues, thinners, hobby chemicals, solvents, or aerosols to the **Wastemobile** which is part of the **Local Hazardous Waste Management Program in King County:**

**Please Note:** Latex paint is no longer considered hazardous waste and the household hazardous waste facilities will not accept it from King County residents. Latex paint should be dried out and the can then placed in the garbage with the lid off.
