Appliances & Scrap Metal	Washers, dryers, microwaves, ovens, stoves, water heaters, VCRs, BBQs, lawn mowers, lawn chairs, swing sets, cast iron sinks and tubs, auto parts, iron, steel, aluminum (cans included), brass, copper.	NO metals that are insulated, rubber coated, oily, previously or currently contain chemicals, paint, or hazardous materials. NO light fixture ballasts.	\$5 for each water heater. Please drain oil and gas from lawnmowers. Cash only.
Refrigerators, Freezers & Air Conditioners	Refrigerators, freezers, and portable household air conditioners.	NO industrial fridges and freezers.	\$25 for each. Cash only.
Toilets & Sinks	Toilet seat, base, and wax ring must be removed.		\$5 each item. Cash only.
Electronics	Cell phones, printers, keyboards, fax machines, scanners, CD/DVD players and stereos.	NO computers, monitors, laptop computers, TVs.	A new Washington State law went into effect Jan. 2, 2009, that provides free recycling of computers, monitors, laptop computers and TVs. For a list of locations, call 1-800-RECYCLE.
Cardboard	Please flatten.	NO wax-coated cardboard.	
Alkaline Batteries	AAA, AA, A, B, C, and D cell batteries only.	No rechargeable batteries/ No Ni-cads	
Lead Acid Batteries	Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle batteries accepted.		
Petroleum-Based Products	Oil filters, motor oil, brake fluid, transmission fluid, steering fluid, crankcase oil, antifreeze, kerosene, diesel oil and home heating fuel.	NO mixed liquids.	Do not mix any liquids together. Please ensure containers are clearly labeled with contents.
Propane Tanks	Residential tanks only, \$5 each. Small canisters up to 16.5 oz., \$1 each.		Cash only.
Tires	Light truck, car and motorcycle tires. Bias ply, steel belted, and studded tires accepted. Limit 8 passenger tires per vehicle (18 inches and below) free of charge.		Additional tires \$1.50 each. Tires on rims \$1.50 each. \$5 for each large truck tire and \$15 each truck tire on rims. Cash only.
Bulky Yard Debris	Logs and large branches greater than four inches in diameter.	NO brush, sod, grass clippings, blackberry bushes, leaves, small branches, rocks or stumps.	Place on tarp for easy removal.
Scrap Wood	Clean wood and pallets.	NO painted, stained, treated or laminated wood or particle board.	Place on tarp for easy removal. No need to remove nails.
Reusable Household Goods	Clothing and miscellaneous household items in good condition.	NO broken, torn, stained, damaged or wet items. No furniture.	All items must be clean and in good enough condition for resale by a charitable organization.
NEW ITEM! Mattresses This is a pilot project!	Mattresses, box springs, and futons, any size.	No commercial loads.	\$10 each. Mattresses need to be dry. May not be taken if deemed 'not recyclable.'

NO flatbeds or dump trucks allowed. Vendors reserve the right to refuse oversized, commercial, contaminated, excessive or unacceptable loads.

DON'T BRING THESE HOUSEHOLD WASTES:

- **NO** construction/demolition debris
- **NO** concrete, rock, brick or asphalt
- **NO** grass, leaves, or small yard debris
- **NO** garbage
- **NO** window glass/mirrors
- **NO** latex paint (see note below)
- **NO** plastic or plastic pools, toys, hoses, etc.
- **NO** painted/treated wood
- **NO** Styrofoam
- **NO** carpeting

Latex paint, if less than a quarter can-full, may be dried out by leaving the lid off, and placed in the garbage once dry. Share larger amounts with friends, donate to a local theater group, or dry by adding equal amounts of cat litter or paint hardener. Donate full cans to Habitat for Humanity: 206.292.5240

DON'T BRING THESE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTES:

- **NO** paint of any kind
- **NO** solvents and thinners
- **NO** cleaning products
- **NO** pesticides/herbicides
- **NO** household chemicals
- **NO** fluorescent lights

Regular **Wastemobile** service is now available at the Auburn SuperMall (near the loading docks and Sports Authority) every 1st and 3rd full weekend of the month, 10 am - 5 pm. The first weekend of the month must include a Friday. If the first day of the month is a Saturday, the Wastemobile will not be open until the following weekend.
