

**Computers, monitors, laptops, and televisions will no longer be accepted at this event.**

You may recycle these materials at NO CHARGE at designated E-Cycle Washington locations. Visit [www.ecyclewashington.org](http://www.ecyclewashington.org) or call 1-800-RECYCLE.

E-Cycle Washington is a new program created by electronics manufacturers to offer residents **FREE** and environmentally responsible recycling for their computers, computer monitors and televisions.

We encourage you to use E-Cycle Washington services. Please note that computer peripherals such as keyboards, mice, and printers are **not** included in the E-Cycle Washington program but will be accepted at this Recycling Collection Event.

## These Household Wastes:

- No paint of any kind \*
- No plastics
- No garbage and trash
- No window glass
- No broken or soiled items

## These Hazardous Wastes:

- No propane tanks
- No oil-based paints / thinners / solvents
- No pesticides
- No cleaning products
- No antifreeze, oil or other automotive products
- No aerosol cans
- No batteries

Most of these hazardous wastes can be taken to the Household Hazardous Wastemobile or one of four household hazardous waste collection sites. ## Curbside Recycling

If you're new to the neighborhood or new to recycling, signing up for curbside service is as easy as calling your garbage hauler. ## Restrictions and Recommendations

- These events are open to King County **households only**.
- Businesses or commercial loads will **NOT** be accepted. Businesses can visit [www.kingcounty.gov/WhatDoIDoWith](http://www.kingcounty.gov/WhatDoIDoWith) for information on recycling options. We reserve the right to refuse oversized loads or loads that appear to be commercial.
- Cars, passenger vans and pick-ups only. Utility trailers up to 10 feet long may be used to haul items to the event.
- Service providers have no obligation to collect any hazardous or other materials that do not conform to the specific descriptions and restrictions listed in this brochure.

Items must meet the following guidelines:

# Here's What You Can Bring:

Item	Accepted	NOT Accepted	Notes
<b>Bulky Wood Waste</b>	Stumps, logs, and limbs at least 4 inches in diameter; pallets and clean, unpainted, untreated wood and plywood.	No tree debris less than 4 inches in diameter or larger than 3 feet in diameter. No twigs, small branches, brush, leaves, grass clippings, sod, soil, or painted, stained or treated wood, particle board, or sheet rock.	Please lay a tarp under wood debris for easy removal.  Nails do not need to be removed.
<b>Electronic Equipment</b>	Cell phones, printers, keyboards, mice, fax machines, photo-copiers, scanners, stereos, VCRs and DVD players.	No commercial equipment.	Equipment can be working or non-working. <b>PLEASE NOTE: Computers, monitors, laptops, and televisions will no longer be accepted.</b>  You can recycle these items for <b>FREE</b> at other locations. See E-Cycle Washington tab for more information.
<b>Household Items</b>	Clothing, shoes, purses, bedding, linens, fabrics, books, games, toys, kitchenware, housewares, garden equipment, and hand tools.	No carpeting, furniture, workstations, any wet, torn, soiled, broken, damaged, or incomplete items.	Must be clean and in good operating condition for resale by a charity. Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot use.
<b>Mattresses</b>	Mattresses, box springs and futons, any size.	No commercial loads. No furniture or frames. No wet or soiled items.	<b>Fee:</b> \$10 per mattress, box spring or futon, <b>CASH ONLY</b> . Items must be dry and clean. Limit: 6 mattresses, box springs, or futons (combined total no more than 6). Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot recycle.
<b>Refrigerators, Freezers, and Household Air Conditioners</b>	Household refrigerators and freezers less than 4-by-6 foot, and household air conditioners.	No commercial appliances or automobile air conditioning units.	<b>Fee:</b> \$10 per unit, <b>CASH ONLY</b> . Other appliances accepted for free as scrap metal (see below).
<b>Scrap Metal</b>	Auto parts, engines and gas mowers (drained of oil and gas), metal lawn chairs, stoves, microwaves, hot water tanks, washers, dryers, cast iron sinks and tubs, swing sets, BBQ's, iron, steel, and other similar metals.	No car bodies, trailers, fluorescent light ballasts or items containing fluids.	Please remove any fluids, rubber, plastic, vinyl, webbing, and wheels from metal.
<b>Styrofoam Blocks and Packing Peanuts</b>	<b>Blocks:</b> Expanded polystyrene only. Look for the #6 or EPS inside the recycling symbol. <b>Blocks and Packing peanuts: must be clean, dry and contained in bags or boxes.</b>	No urethane foam cushions, hot tub covers, expanded polypropylene or foam insulation.	<b>Blocks:</b> Expanded polystyrene only. Look for the #6 or EPS inside the recycling symbol. <b>Packing peanuts:</b> Please keep in a box or bag. <b>All materials must be clean and dry.</b>
<b>Tires</b>	Light truck, car, motorcycle, and bike tires, including bias, steel belted, and studded tires.	No oversized tires accepted (for example, tractor or backhoe tires).	<b>Fee: Tires 18.5 inches or below in diameter:</b> Up to 8 tires off rim: no charge; \$3.00 each for all tires on rim. More than 8 tires: \$4.50 each on rim; \$1.50 each off rim. <b>Large truck tires (more than 18.5 inches inner diameter):</b> \$5 each off rim and \$15 charged for each truck tire on rim. <b>CASH ONLY.</b> No oversized tires accepted (for example, tractor or backhoe tires).
