You Can Bring...

Only the Following Items Will be Accepted.....

- **TIRES:** Bias ply, steel belted, and studded tires accepted. **Limit 6 passenger tires per household (18 inches and below) free of charge. \$1.50 charge for each tire on a rim. \$5 charged for each large truck tire and \$15 charged for each truck tire on rim (cash only). No oversized tires accepted.**
- **MOTOR OIL, FILTERS, & ANTIFREEZE:** Motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, brake fluid, transmission fluid, 2-cycle oil, steering fluid, crankcase oil, kerosene, and home heating fuel. Do not mix antifreeze with solvents, gasoline, or other substances.



- **LEAD ACID BATTERIES:** Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle batteries accepted.
- **BATTERIES:** AAAA, AAA, AA, A, B, C, and D cell batteries. Also accepted are rechargeable batteries and cellphone batteries.
- **CARDBOARD:** Please flatten. No wax coated cardboard.
- **HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND CLOTHING:** Clothing and miscellaneous household items in good condition. Furniture will not be collected. Items in need of repair will not be accepted.
- **PORCELAIN TOILETS AND SINKS:** Remove toilet seats, hardware, and wax rings. **\$10 charge (cash only).**
- **PROPANE TANKS:** Residential tanks only. **\$5 charge (cash only).**
- **BULKY WOOD:** Logs, large tree branches (minimum 6 inches in diameter), clean wood, plywood, pallets, and other untreated and unpainted wood. **No leaves, grass, small branches, or sod. No peg board, particle, or press board. Please lay a tarp under material for ease of removal.**
- **APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METAL:** Auto parts, lawn chairs, stoves, microwaves, barbecues, engines and gas lawnmowers (**drained of oil and gasoline**), iron, steel, aluminum, brass, copper and other ferrous and nonferrous metals. **\$5 will be charged for each water heater that still has insulation coating (cash only).** Metals that are insulated, rubber or oil coated, previously or currently contain **gas, oil, chemicals, paint, or hazardous materials** will not be accepted. Light fixture ballasts and sealed drums will not be accepted.
- **REFRIGERATORS/FREEZERS/HOUSEHOLD AIR CONDITIONERS:** **\$10 charge for each refrigerator, freezer, or household air conditioner (cash only).**
- **MATTRESSES/FUTONS:** Mattresses, box springs and futons, any size. **Fee: \$10 per mattress, box spring, or futon (cash only).** Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot recycle. **No furniture or frames. No wet or soiled items.**
- **ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT:** DVD players, VCRs, stereo equipment, printers, copiers, fax machines, scanners, cellular phones (**remove personal information**) and computer peripherals such as keyboards and mice. **Computer monitors and televisions will not be accepted. You can recycle these items for free at other locations - see the E-Cycle box below for more information.**

DON'T BRING!



These household wastes:
No paint of any kind

- No construction/demolition debris
- No garbage
- No furniture
- No plastic toys, hoses, etc.
- No window glass

These hazardous wastes:

- No oil based paint/solvents
- No pesticides/herbicides
- No household chemicals
- No cleaning products
- No fluorescent lights

Household hazardous wastes (but not latex paint) can be taken to the Household Hazardous Wastemobile at the Outlet Collection every Saturday and Sunday from 10 am to 5 pm (except Thanksgiving and Christmas). The Wastemobile will be located in the Northwest corner of the mall off of Outlet Collection Drive SW (near the loading docks and Sports Authority). Segregate motor oil (crankcase oil) from all other fluids, including brake fluid, hydraulic fluid, differential oil, and transmission oil. Other types of oil can be added together and brought to the facility in a separate container.

Call 1-800-RECYCLE or visit 1800recycle.wa.gov to find authorized E-Cycle Washington collection locations. You may drop off computers, computer monitors, laptops, and televisions at no charge at the following E-Cycle Washington locations: A Plus Removal and Recycle (1302 West Main St, Suite 25, Auburn, WA 98001, 253-737-4441), and Auburn Goodwill Store (1519 Auburn Way S, Auburn, WA 98002, 253-573-1333). Please note - drop off locations and charges may change and quantities accepted may be limited. Please also note that computer peripherals such as keyboards, mice, and printers are not included in this program but will be accepted at the City Recycling Collection Event. Beware, it is always a good idea to delete or remove all personal information from any item you are recycling - better safe than sorry.

Rain Barrel, Compost, and Worm Bin Sale

Saturday - May 3, 2014 - starting at 9 am

All items \$20 each. **Cash only.** While supplies last. No pre or post event sales.

To encourage the use of recycled content material and more efficient use of water, Algona and Pacific are offering recycled plastic **rain barrels** at a huge discount. In addition, start backyard composting with a **compost bin** to save resources and money. Composting is a natural process that turns yard waste into rich soil. Yard waste contains mostly water. Once the material decomposes, rich soil is all that's left.



Worm bin composting is an efficient way to convert kitchen scraps into nutrient-rich compost for your garden. Simple to assemble and can be stored in or outside. Made in the US and constructed from high quality recycled plastic.
