# Utilities and energy conservation

- Utility energy efficiency programs offer
  - Cash
  - Technical assistance
- Changing the market by changing customer decisions
  - Saves energy
  - Avoids the cost of new infrastructure
  - Helps speed up the rate of innovation



# City Light conservation programs

- Facility audits
- Engineering analysis assistance
- Cash rebates on energy efficient equipment
  - Small business: simple rebates
  - Larger facilities: Custom incentives on 100+ equipment types
- Coming soon
  - Trade ally network – match contractors, customers
  - Cash rebates on commissioning/re-commissioning
  - Financing for energy conservation projects



# Typical energy efficiency projects

- Applications
  - Lighting
  - Space conditioning
    - Building envelope
    - HVAC
  - Water heating
  - Food preparation & refrigeration
  - Computers, data centers
  - Elevators & escalators
  - Other equipment: Motors, compressors, etc...
- Spaces
  - Offices
  - Classrooms
  - Restaurants/cafeterias
  - Administrative facilities
  - Specialty facilities
  - Etc...
- Custom incentives are available for most technologies that can save energy



# City Light renewable programs

- For customers who want green power without installing it
  - REC and voluntary programs
- For customers who want to install green power
  - Assistance with interconnection, net metering
  - Assistance with WA state incentive program
