Project activity since the last SAG meeting

Core Cities Review

- The County turned over all siting data to allow the Core Cities to conduct their own review.
- Requested further evaluation of the parcel at 15062 Juanita-Woodinville Way NE, includes a southern portion of the Brickyard Park and Ride in Bothell.

Brickyard Park & Ride

- Parcel originally screened out due to current use
- County evaluated the parcel using the same Broad Area Site Screening (BASS) and Focused Site Screening (FSS) criteria
- Site constraints: wetlands, WSDOT right-of-way, future transit plans, existing uses
- Decision: Not including in environmental review



Public Forum Recap

- 232 people in attendance
- 47 written questions submitted in advance
- 64 written questions submitted live
- 6 oral questions asked live

Public Forum Recap

- Common themes of submitted questions:
 - Traffic impacts
 - Siting process and criteria
 - Business and community impacts
 - Siting area (radius, centroid, Urban Growth Area)
 - Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and environmental review process
 - Current Houghton station and closed landfill
 - Project timeline (environmental review, final site selection, construction)
 - Modern transfer stations

15801 Woodinville Redmond Rd NE, Woodinville

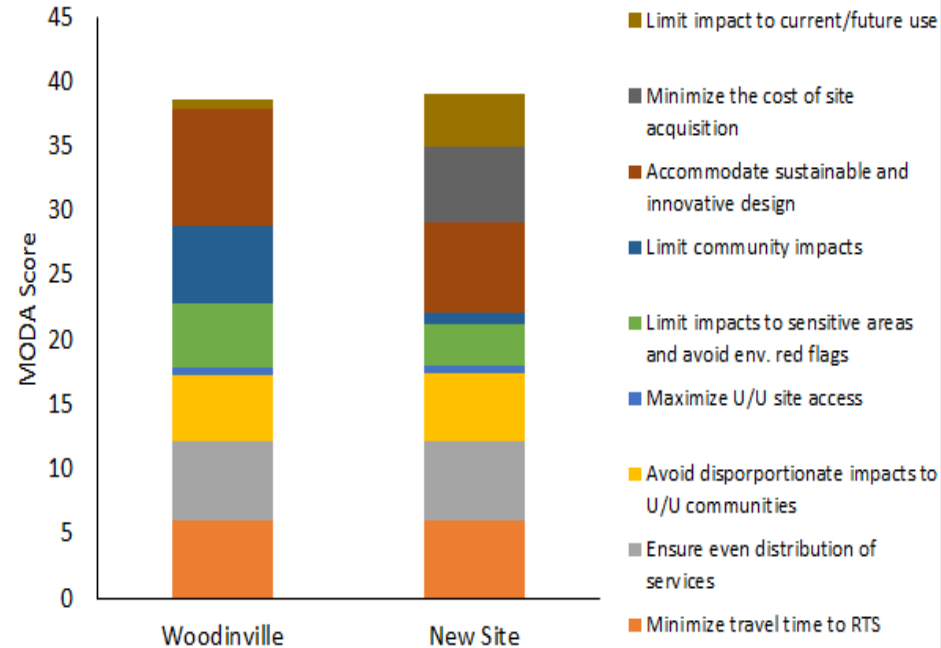
Size:	12.9 Acres
Zoning:	Industrial
Current use:	Construction, Portable toilet rental, Manufacturing, Automotive, Accessories, Vacant
Critical areas:	Seismic Hazard Identified; Unnamed stream just south of site running east-west (not on site)

SAG Input on Woodinville Sites

- Process concerns
- Need for more transparency
- More info on 200 → 15 → 4
- Concerns about fairness re: winsome trading (WMB)
- Desire to abstain from recommending either site
- Concerns about either site making it through the EIS
- Woodinville 2 would be the preferred site by 6 SAG members if they would choose between the 2 sites
- Integrating community criteria
- Consider more innovation
- Environmental impacts, deconstructing on Woodinville 1

Next Steps

- County selects sites for environmental review (May 2022)
- Project team conducts environmental review (June – February 2024)
 - SAG and community provide input for scope of what to study
 - SAG and community review and provide input on draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)
- Final site selection (Spring 2024)
- Begin site design (2024)



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
