



Construction of new sewer and water lines progresses in Innis Arden

To ensure safe and reliable operations and protect public health and the environment, King County is currently replacing the county's aging Boeing Creek Trunk sewer lines in Innis Arden in Shoreline. In partnership with Seattle Public Utilities, about 5,000 feet of water mains will be replaced as part of this work, as well as some of Ronald Wastewater District's local sewers.

Upcoming construction activities

The work area extends from near the Innis Arden Clubhouse south along Springdale Avenue NW and 14th Avenue Northwest, to the 17000 block of 15th Avenue NW. King County's contractor, Frank Coluccio Construction Company, is currently working at multiple locations along Springdale Avenue NW and 14th Avenue NW. Different crews are working on sewer and water line replacement and temporary road restoration. Most work will be completed by summer 2008.

Construction challenges

Work in this area involves replacing multiple pipes. These pipelines are located up to 25 feet below the surface, requiring deep excavation and steel supports to complete work and protect workers. Since all utilities are located underground, the crews must work around numerous underground utility lines, sometimes in unexpected locations. Work may require utility service interruptions. Because of these challenges, the construction schedule and approach change frequently. While

usual work hours extend from 7 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. on weekdays, crews may work until 10 p.m. on weekdays and from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. on Saturdays depending on conditions.

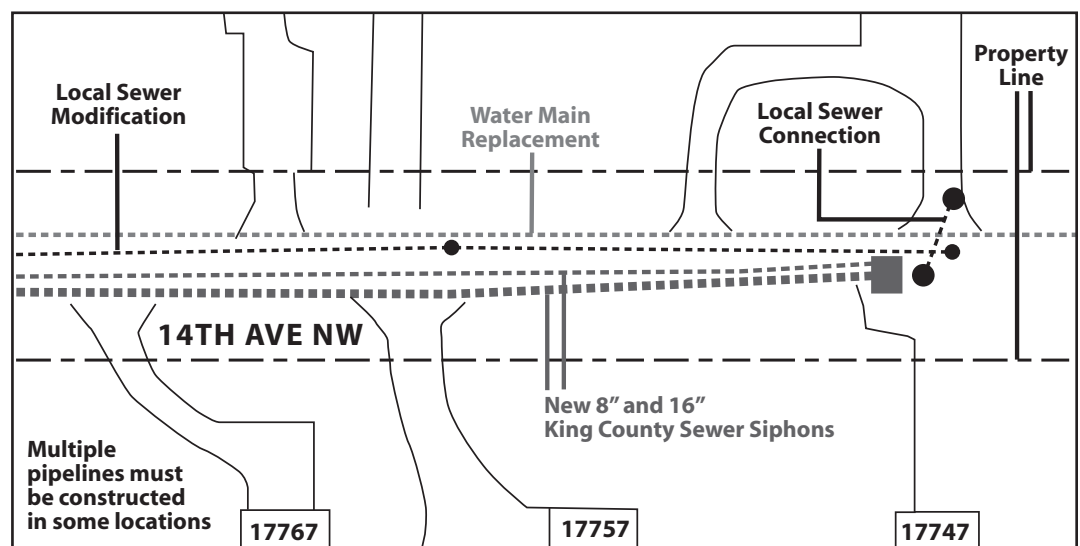
Storage areas for construction materials and equipment are limited in the Innis Arden area. To reduce traffic impacts and speed up work in the area, FCCC has made an arrangement for staging at the Innis Arden Club during this work. Materials may also be stored along the road in the city-owned right-of-way.

Being a good neighbor during construction

King County is committed to work closely with project neighbors during this construction project.

- The contractor is working to maintain traffic flow through the area as work proceeds in the streets.
- County staff members are available to work one-on-one with project neighbors to answer questions and address specific concerns.

At the end of construction, the road will be completely paved and a widened asphalt shoulder will be added. The new utilities will have a design life of more than 50 years. Your patience during construction is appreciated.
