Name of Proposal: Belmondo Revetment Enhancement Project

Description of Proposal:

King County Water and Land Resources Division proposes to reconstruct 370 linear feet of existing streambank revetment on the left bank of the Cedar River with vegetated geogrids and four streambank enhancement structures. The primary purpose of the project is to continue and complete the bank stabilization and flood control that was initiated with the emergency repair that was performed in January 2009. The secondary purpose of the project is to provide mitigation for impacts to aquatic habitat associated with the Cedar Rapids Levee Setback Repair project.

The Project will enhance the quantity and quality of aquatic habitat to be consistent with state and county standards for streambank stabilization projects. The instream structures incorporate the use of boulders, large wood (LW) and rock ballasting to trap sediment, scour pools, create fish refugia, and establish riparian shade and cover.

Location of Proposal:

The Project is located in the Belmondo Reach of the Lower Cedar River, which extends from RM 9.4 to RM 10.8. The project site is located four miles southeast of Renton and four miles north of Maple Valley just east of SR-169 (Renton-Maple Valley Road) on the east side of the Cedar River Trail. The nearest street address is 16916 Renton-Maple Valley Road. The property is located in the southwest quarter of Section 29, Township 23 North, Range 6 East (Willamette Meridian).
