***Project Description:*** Fee acquisition of 273 acres (11 parcels) of Weyerhaeuser lands along the final remaining missing link in the 30-mile Snoqualmie Valley Trail corridor. Acquire right-of-way, Mill Pond, Snoqualmie River frontage. Located within City of Snoqualmie.

Fee acquisitions on several parcels will complete a 1-mile missing link on the 30-mile Snoqualmie Valley Trail regional corridor, from Duvall to Rattlesnake Lake. DNRP has recently closed on two other missing portions of the corridor (in 2012 & 2015).

DNRP and Weyerhaeuser are in negotiations now for the Weyerhaeuser lands. Environmental review is still underway.

***Habitat Benefit:*** Mill pond and Snoqualmie shoreline have significant habitat benefit.

***Recreation Benefit:*** Regional trail, may be associated passive open space.

***Plan Priority:*** The project is listed in King County's Regional Trails Needs Report (RTNR) and Comprehensive Plan.
