

**AMENDMENT TO THE CONSERVATION FUTURES  
INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN KING COUNTY AND THE CITY OF BELLEVUE  
FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS**

**Preamble**

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Levy Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County and certain cities. This amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for open space acquisition.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF BELLEVUE and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties on the 26th day of December, 1990, as previously amended.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

**Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals**

These paragraphs are hereby added to the Recitals Section to provide for a Conservation Futures Levy Fund allocation for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project, and hereafter read:

- On November 13, 2012, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17476, which appropriated a total of Seven Hundred and Forty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$749,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Bellevue for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project. On March 4, 2013, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17534, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into an amendment to the interlocal agreement with the City of Bellevue for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds appropriated in Ordinance 17476.
- On December 9, 2013, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17707, which appropriated a total of Six Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Bellevue for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project. On April 29, 2014, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17795, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into an amendment to the interlocal agreement with the City of Bellevue for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds appropriated in Ordinance 17707.
- On November 17, 2014, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17941, which appropriated a total of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Bellevue for the Bellevue

Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project. On April 21, 2015, the King County Council passed Ordinance 18023, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into an amendment to the interlocal agreement with the City of Bellevue for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds appropriated in Ordinance 17941.

- On September 14, 2015, the King County Council passed Ordinance 18110, which appropriated no new Dollars (\$0) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds, but confirmed the scope of the December 9, 2013 appropriation of Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Bellevue for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project.
- On February 22, 2016, the King County Council passed Ordinance 18239, which appropriated a total of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Bellevue for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project. On July 5, 2016, the King County Council passed Ordinance 18312, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into an amendment to the interlocal agreement with the City of Bellevue for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds appropriated in Ordinance 18239.
- On November 14, 2016, the King County Council passed Ordinance 18409, which appropriated a total of Three Hundred and Ninety-Seven Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$397,500) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Bellevue for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project. On March 13, 2017, the King County Council passed Ordinance 18477, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into an amendment to the interlocal agreement with the City of Bellevue for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds appropriated in Ordinance 18409.

#### **Amendment 2: Article V. Conditions of Agreement**

Section 5.1 is amended to include Attachment O, which lists a 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 Conservation Futures Levy Allocation, and a 2015 scope confirmation for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project.

#### **Amendment 3: Article VII. Responsibilities of County**

The first two sentences of this article are amended to include references to Attachment O, which lists a 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 Conservation Futures Levy proceeds allocation, and a 2015 scope confirmation, for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space System Acquisition Project:

Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amounts shown in Attachments A through O, to be used for the Projects listed in Attachments A through O. The City may request additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City for the Projects in excess of the total amounts shown in Attachments A through O. The County assumes no obligation for the future support of the Projects described herein except as expressly set forth in this agreement.

**Amendment 4: Attachment O**


The Attachments to the interlocal agreement are hereby amended by adding Attachment O, which is hereby attached to the interlocal agreement, incorporated therein and made a part thereof.

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as previously amended.

This document shall be attached to the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.



**Project Description:**

**1047277 – Bellevue – WLCF BEL Bellevue Greenway and Open Space System**

This is a multiple-parcel, multiple-year open space acquisition project, which will acquire additional open space parcels in the City of Bellevue.

2013: \$749,000 is allocated to this multi-year, multi-parcel open space acquisition project. The first priority will be to acquire two adjacent parcels totaling six acres, at 118th Avenue SE, at Mercer Slough Open Space in Bellevue.

2014: \$650,000 is added to this multiple-parcel, multiple-year open space acquisition project. As a first priority, Bellevue will seek to acquire open space property in the Bridle Trails Community at a three parcel, 15-acre wetland area located on 116th Avenue NE.

2015: \$800,000 is allocated to this open space acquisition project. As a first priority, Bellevue will seek to acquire a 5.75-acre forested uplands property adjacent to Vasa Park at SE 38th Street in Bellevue, just north of Interstate 90.

2015: Scope confirmation – Under the 2014 CFT allocation for the Bellevue Greenways and Open Space CFT project, Bellevue was allocated \$650,000 in fiscal year 2014 CFT funds with a priority of acquiring open space in the Bridle Trails Community in North Bellevue west of 148th Avenue NE. A contingency in the funding allocation requires Bellevue to identify a final site for King County approval, before funds are released for the acquisition. Bellevue Parks has worked with the Bridle Trails Community Club to identify an open space acquisition site, and after conducting a review process, the Community Club and Bellevue Parks have identified a 1.65-acre property containing Valley Creek, more centrally located in the community, along the east side of 140th Avenue NE (north of NE 44th Place), which is the confirmed scope for this project funding.

2016: \$500,000 is allocated to this previously partially-funded project. The first priority for this year's allocation is the acquisition of a five-acre woodland addition to an existing open space on SE 60th Street, south of 116th Avenue, in south Bellevue.

2017: \$397,500 is allocated to this previously partially-funded project. The first priority for this year's allocation is the acquisition of a four-acre woodland addition to an existing open space on SE Lake Washington Boulevard, south of 116th Avenue, in south Bellevue.
