

**AMENDMENT TO THE INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN KING COUNTY AND THE CITY OF ISSAQUAH  
FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS**

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**Preamble**

The King County Council, through Ordinance 8867, established a process to allocate the proceeds of Conservation Future Levy collections and through Ordinance 9128, established a Conservation Futures Fund to collect the levy funds. In accordance with Ordinance 8867 the King County Open Space Oversight Committee has recommended allocation of the 1996-1997 proceeds and the King County Council through Ordinance 12926 has approved the allocation. This amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of these additional funds made available for open space acquisition. The parties have agreed to amend the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement to provide for additions in the references to the fund allocation.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF ISSAQUAH and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties, dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of June 1990.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

**Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals**

The Recitals Section, as amended, is hereby appended to provide for the 1996/97 allocation, by adding thereto the following paragraph:

“On October 20, 1997, the King County Council approved the allocation of 1996/97 Conservation Futures Funds by passing Ordinance Number 12926, appropriating \$6,054,000 in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds and authorized the King County Executive to enter into interlocal cooperation agreements with the City of Seattle and the Suburban Cities in order to initiate the approved projects.”

**Attachment E: City of Conservation Futures Allocations**

Attachment E to the Interlocal Agreement, as amended, is hereby appended by adding thereto the following allocation and project description:

Waterways 2000	\$250,000

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In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.

PROJECT NAME

Waterways 2000

AMOUNT

\$250,000

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project is a joint project with King County that consists of acquisition of several eligible streamside properties to carry the Waterways 2000 concept to the basin that ranked highest among unfunded basins in the program. The City and King proposed to preserve streamside salmon spawning habitat to better project this salmon-bearing creek and contribute to the city's ongoing greenway project. Project funds are divided evenly between purchases in Issaquah and King County, and other conservation tools such as the Public Benefit Rating System (PBRs) tax incentive program should be employed to maximize the impact of this effort.
