**AMENDMENT TO THE CONSERVATION FUTURES
INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN KING COUNTY AND THE CITY OF NORMANDY PARK
FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS**

Preamble

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Levy Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County, the City of Seattle and certain suburban cities through the procedures set forth in Ordinance 8867, as amended by Ordinance 14714. This amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for open space acquisition.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF NORMANDY PARK and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties on the 2nd day of February, 2010.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals

A paragraph is hereby added to the Recitals Section to provide for Conservation Futures Levy Fund allocations for the Normandy Park Greenway and Open Space System, and hereafter reads:

- On September 6, 2011, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17181, which appropriated a total of Five Hundred and Sixty Three Thousand (\$563,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Normandy Park for the Beaconsfield-on-the Sound acquisition Project. On December 12, 2011 the King County Council passed Ordinance 17242, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 17181.
- On November 9, 2011, the King County Council passed Ordinance 17232, which appropriated a total of Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Normandy Park for the Beaconsfield-on-the-Sound acquisition Project. On June 18, 2012 the King County Council passed Ordinance 17345, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 17232.

Amendment 2: Article V. Conditions of Agreement

Section 5.1 is amended to include references to Attachment C, which lists 2011 and 2012 Conservation Futures Levy Allocations for the Normandy Park Beaconsfield-on-the-Sound acquisition Project.

Amendment 3: Article VII. Responsibilities of County

The first two sentences of this article are appended to include Attachment C, which lists 2011 and 2012 Conservation Futures Levy Allocations for the Normandy Park Beaconsfield-on-the-Sound acquisition Project, as follows:

Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amounts shown in Attachments A through C to be used for the Projects listed in Attachments A through C. The City may request additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City for the Projects in excess of the total amounts shown in Attachments A through C. The County assumes no obligation for the future support of the Projects described herein except as expressly set forth in this agreement.

Amendment 4: Attachment C

The attachments to the interlocal agreement are hereby amended by adding Attachment C, which is hereby attached to the interlocal agreement, incorporated therein and made a part thereof.

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as previously amended.

This document shall be attached to the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.





Project Descriptions:

Ordinance 17181:

315787 Normandy Park - Beaconsfield on the Sound

2011: \$563,000 in additional funding is provided to this Puget Sound shoreline acquisition project from Normandy Park's abandoned Walker Creek Preserve Project. This project has many parcels and owners. The project will provide additional public beach access, preserve scenic Puget Sound shoreline from development, and protect upland shoreline habitat. It will also help prevent the construction of additional shoreline bulkheads, and potentially allow for removal of some existing shoreline armoring, if that is found to be feasible.

Ordinance 17232:

315787 Normandy Park - Beaconsfield on the Sound

2012: \$300,000 is provided for additional acquisition of parcels within this multi-year, multi-parcel acquisition project with a goal of restoring natural gravel replenishment of the beach, important for salmonid and marine wildlife species. The project will also improve public access to Puget Sound Shoreline.
