**Preamble**

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County, the City of Seattle, and certain suburban cities. Ordinance 9430 provided for the use of Conservation Futures Funds collected in the years 1990 through 1993 for the completion of projects as set forth in Ordinance 9071. This amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for project completion. The parties have agreed to amend the existing Interlocal Cooperative Agreement to provide for additions in the references to the fund allocation.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF SEATTLE ("City") and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties, dated the 5th day of June, 1990.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

**Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals**

The fourth paragraph of the Recitals Section is hereby amended to add the following language to provide for the 1993 allocation:

"The King County Council included a proviso in the 1994 adopted budget Ordinance 11130 appropriating Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in 1993 conservation futures revenue for transfer to the City of Seattle, to be used for public open space acquisitions in southeast Seattle. The Council, by Motion 9288, has approved the allocation of this revenue for acquisitions in the East Duwamish Greenbelt, Cheasty Natural Area, Mountain View Natural Area, Kubota Gardens Natural Area, and Lakeridge Park, and authorized the King County Executive to amend the interlocal agreement with the City of Seattle in order to initiate the approved payment."

**Amendment 2: Article VI. Responsibility of County**

The first two sentences of this article are amended to include Attachment F, which provides a copy of Motion 9288 authorizing this expenditure, and hereafter reads:

"Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amount shown


in Attachments A, B, C, D, E and F. The City may request additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City in excess of the amount shown in Attachments A, B, C, D, E and F."

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperative Agreement.

This document shall be attached to be a part of the existing Interlocal Cooperative Agreement.

9 WHEREAS, the King County Council included a proviso in  
10 the 1994 adopted budget Ordinance 11130 directing the City of  
11 Seattle to submit by April 15, 1994 for County Council  
12 approval a recommendation for public open space acquisitions  
13 in southeast Seattle, including individual project budgets  
14 for each proposed acquisition;

15 WHEREAS, the budget proviso states that \$2 million in  
16 1993 conservation futures revenue shall be transferred to  
17 Seattle on a cost reimbursement basis for acquisition of the  
18 properties identified by Seattle and approved by the County  
19 Council;

20 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle Open Space Program  
21 developed a planning process to involve the residents of  
22 Southeast Seattle in establishing a priority list for  
23 acquisition of public open space, including conducting two  
24 public meetings in Southeast Seattle to solicit citizen  
25 comment and input;

26 WHEREAS, through the citizen involvement process, the  
27 City of Seattle Open Space Program has identified five public  
28 open space acquisition projects in Southeast Seattle and has  
29 outlined those recommendations, along with individual  
30 itemized project budgets, in a report submitted to the  
31 Metropolitan King County Council;

1 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King  
2 County:

3 SECTION 1. The City of Seattle Open Space Program  
4 recommendations relating to open space acquisitions for  
5 Southeast Seattle, attached as Exhibit A, are hereby  
6 approved.

7 SECTION 2. The county executive is hereby authorized  
8 and directed to release the amount of \$2 million in 1993  
9 conservation futures revenue from Ordinance 11130, Section  
10 117 as follows:
