**AMENDMENT TO THE CONSERVATION FUTURES
INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN KING COUNTY AND THE CITY OF SHORELINE
FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS**

Preamble

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Levy Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County, the City of Seattle and certain suburban cities through the procedures set forth in Ordinance 8867, as amended by Ordinance 14714. This amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for open space acquisition.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF SHORELINE and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties on the 9th day of June, 2003, as previously amended.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals

A paragraph is hereby added to the Recitals Section to provide for a Conservation Futures Levy Fund allocation for the Shoreline South Woods Addition and North Hamlin Park Addition open space acquisition projects, and hereafter reads:

- On November 21, 2005, the King County Council passed Ordinance 15333, which appropriated a total of Four Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Shoreline for the South Woods Addition acquisition Project, and Five Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Shoreline for the North Hamlin Park Addition acquisition Project. On April 17, 2006 the King County Council passed Ordinance 15423, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 15333.

Amendment 2: Article V. Conditions of Agreement

Section 5.1 is appended to include Attachment C, which lists a 2006 Conservation Futures Levy Allocation for the Shoreline South Woods Project and the Shoreline North Hamlin Park Addition acquisition Project.

Amendment 3: Article VII. Responsibilities of County

The first two sentences of this article are appended to include Attachment C, which lists a 2006 Conservation Futures Levy proceeds allocation for the Shoreline South Woods Addition Project and the Shoreline North Hamlin Park Addition acquisition Project:

Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amounts shown in Attachments A through C to be used for the Projects listed in Attachments A through C. The City may request additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City for the Projects in excess of the total amounts shown in Attachments A through C. The County assumes no obligation for the future support of the Projects described herein except as expressly set forth in this agreement.

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as previously amended.

This document shall be attached to the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.

Project Descriptions:

South Woods Addition: This project consists of the acquisition of up to 15.6-ares of second growth conifer forest located at 25th Avenue NE and NE 150th Street, immediately south of Shorecrest High School in Shoreline. The forest has songbird habitat and some urban wildlife associated with its mature conifer trees. It also provides forested headwaters for a branch of Thornton Creek and will provide a setting for environmental education for the nearby school.

North Hamlin Park Addition: This project consists of the acquisition of an 8.3-acre site in the City of Shoreline that contains woodland and open field habitat, bounded to the north by 168th Street Northeast and to the south by 73-acre Hamlin Park. The property contains a mixture of good songbird and urban wildlife habitat.
