**AMENDMENT TO THE CONSERVATION FUTURES  
INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN KING COUNTY AND THE CITY OF SNOQUALMIE  
FOR OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION PROJECTS**

**Preamble**

The King County Council, through Ordinance 9128, has established a Conservation Futures Levy Fund and appropriated proceeds to King County, the City of Seattle and certain suburban cities. This amendment is entered into to provide for the allocation of additional funds made available for open space acquisition.

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into between the CITY OF SNOQUALMIE and KING COUNTY, and amends and attaches to and is part thereof of the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement entered into between the parties on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1994.

The parties agree to the following amendments:

**Amendment 1: Article 1. Recitals**

A paragraph is hereby added to the Recitals Section to provide for a Conservation Futures Levy Fund allocation for the Snoqualmie Riverfront Reach acquisition, and hereafter reads:

- On November 23, 2009 the King County Council passed Ordinance 16717, which appropriated a total of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) in Conservation Futures Levy proceeds to the City of Snoqualmie's Snoqualmie Riverfront Reach acquisition Project. On May 24, 2010 the King County Council passed Ordinance 16842, authorizing the King County Executive to enter into interlocal agreements with the City of Seattle and the suburban cities for the disbursement of Conservation Futures Funds in Ordinance 16717.

**Amendment 2: Article V. Conditions of Agreement**

Section 5.1 is amended to include reference to Attachment D, which lists a 2010 Conservation Futures Levy Allocation for the Snoqualmie Riverfront Reach acquisition project.

**Amendment 3: Article VII. Responsibilities of County**

The first two sentences of this article are amended to include references to Attachment D, which lists a 2010 Conservation Futures Levy Allocation for the Snoqualmie Riverfront Reach acquisition project as follows:

Subject to the terms of this agreement, the County will provide Conservation Futures Levy Funds in the amounts shown in Attachments A through D to be used for the Projects listed in Attachments A through D. The City may request additional funds; however, the County has no obligation to provide funds to the City for the Projects in excess of the total amounts shown in Attachments A through D. The County assumes no obligation for the future support of the Projects described herein except as expressly set forth in this agreement.

**AMENDMENT 4: Attachment D**

The attachments to the interlocal agreement are hereby amended by adding Attachment D, which is hereby attached to the interlocal agreement, incorporated therein and made a part thereof.

In all other respects, the terms, conditions, duties and obligations of both parties shall remain the same as agreed to in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as previously amended.

This document shall be attached to the existing Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.
