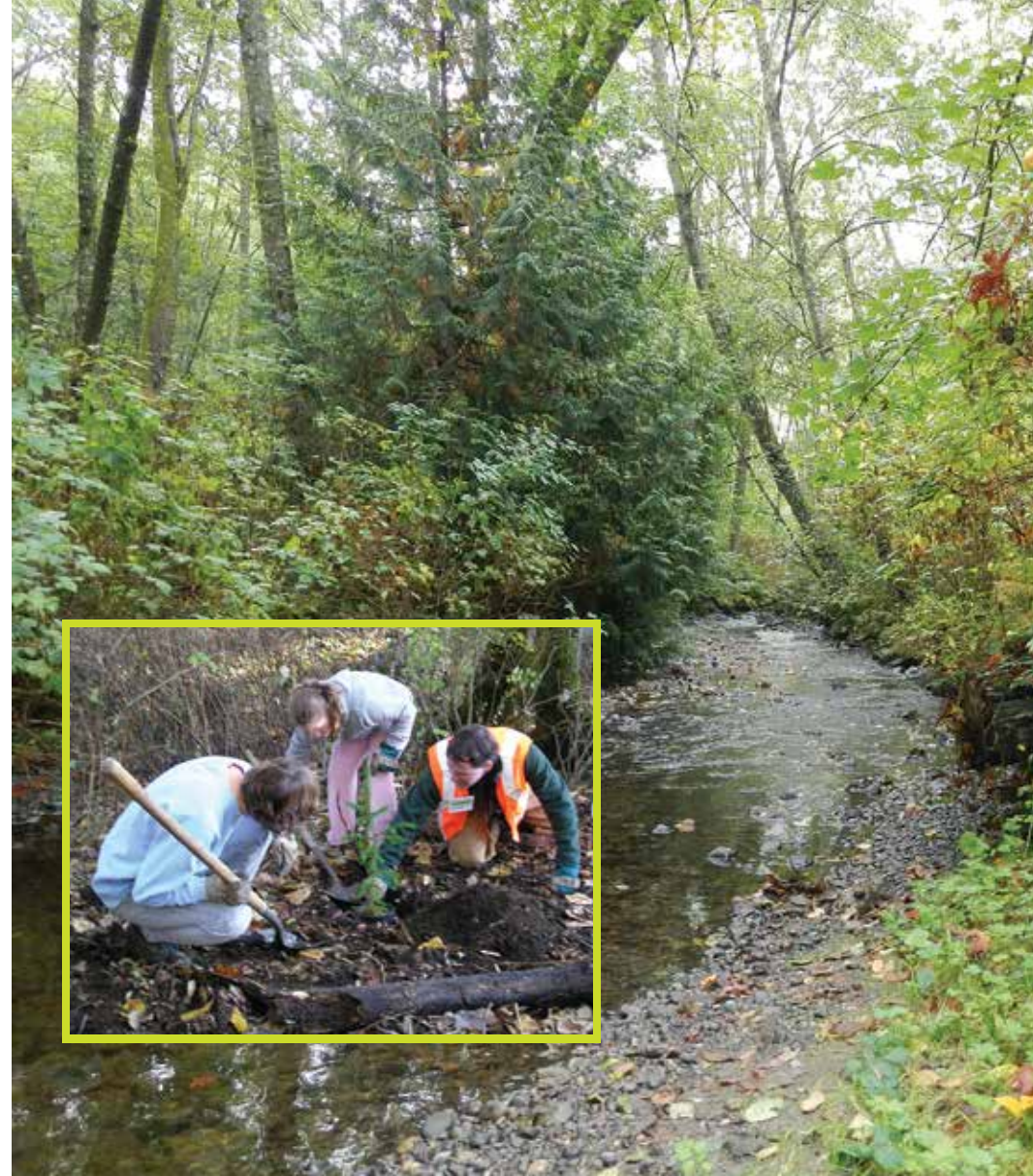

Miller-Walker Basin Stewardship

The goals of the Miller-Walker Basin Stewardship Program are to (1) clean up and improve the health of Miller and Walker Creeks for fish and people, and (2) provide information and assistance to residents about the health of the local environment and Puget Sound.

The Miller-Walker Basin Steward is available to provide the following services:



Monitoring the Health of Miller and Walker Creeks

- Learn about coho and chum salmon in Miller and Walker Creeks.
- Volunteer to count salmon as part of the popular Community Salmon Investigation (CSI) for Highline each fall, October through December.
- Review stream flow, water quality, and other measurements to track the health of Miller and Walker Creeks. See the Monitoring section of the website to find out more!

Stream Restoration Volunteer Events

- Join a volunteer forest restoration work party! Everyone is welcome. Check the volunteer calendar on the website for the schedule.
- Contact the Miller-Walker Basin Steward to schedule your group for a special event.
- Become a habitat steward and adopt a Miller-Walker site

Stewardship Assistance for Watershed Residents

- Get help with plant identification, ideas for vegetation management near creeks and wetlands, plant selection, and assistance with restoration.
- Request assistance to reduce polluted runoff, improve drainage, and/or build a rain garden.
- Review low impact development resources, including maps of infiltration potential in the Miller-Walker basin.
