

Caution: Watch out for Poison-Hemlock

Poison-hemlock is toxic to people and animals.



Second-year plants are 5-10 ft. tall with many tiny white flowers in umbrella-shaped clusters from April to June.



Young poison-hemlock looks like a carrot plant.



Roots look like wild carrots, but all plant parts are poisonous.



Hairless stems have purple or reddish blotches.



Dig up or pull, and discard in trash. Always wear gloves.



Plants have a musty odor.



First-year plants grow in low clumps and can be found all year.
