

## COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT

In accordance with Chapter 39.34 RCW, **KING COUNTY** and Whatcom Transportation Authority agrees to a cooperative governmental purchasing agreement for Diesel Particulate Filters using King County's competitively awarded contract # 197147.

King County therefore extends the use of its contracts to Whatcom Transportation Authority to the extent provided by law and upon the following terms:

1. The vendor agrees to extend to Whatcom Transportation Authority, the terms and conditions of King County's contract.
2. Whatcom Transportation Authority accepts responsibility for compliance with any additional or varying laws and regulations governing its purchases. Any purchases by Whatcom Transportation Authority shall be affected by a purchase order from Whatcom Transportation Authority and directed to the vendor.
3. King County accepts no responsibility for the performance of any of the purchasing contracts by the vendor.
4. King County accepts no responsibility for payment of the purchase price by Whatcom Transportation Authority.

This agreement may be revoked at any time in writing, by either party.




