

White Center




Evergreen High School is located on the corner of 10th Avenue SW and SW 116th Street. Enter the site from 10th Avenue SW.

LIST OF ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

PLEASE DON'T BRING:

Scrap Metal

Fee: No charge

Please remove any fluids, rubber, plastic, vinyl, webbing, and wheels.

Accepted: Auto parts, lawn chairs, stoves, microwaves, hot water tanks, washers, dryers, cast iron sinks and tubs, swing sets, VCRs, lawn mowers, BBQs, iron, steel and other similar items.

Not accepted: Car bodies, trailers, fluorescent light ballasts or items containing fluids.

Bulky Wood Waste

Fee: No charge

Please lay a tarp under wood debris for easy removal. Tree debris **must be 4 inches or larger in diameter.**

Accepted: Stumps, logs & limbs at least 4 inches in diameter; pallets, and clean, unpainted, untreated wood and plywood. Nails do not need to be removed.

Not Accepted: No tree debris less than 4 inches in diameter. No twigs, small branches, prunings, brush, leaves, grass, clippings, sod, soil, or painted, stained, treated wood, particle board, or sheet rock.

Refrigerators, Freezers, & Household Air Conditioners

Fee: \$25 per unit, **CASH ONLY.**

Accepted: Household refrigerators and freezers less than 4-by-8 foot, and household air conditioners.

Not accepted: Commercial appliances or automobile air conditioning units.

Tires

Fee: Up to 8 tires off rim - no charge; \$3.00 each for all tires on rim. More than eight tires: \$4.50 each on rim; \$1.50 each off rim. **CASH ONLY.**

Accepted: Light truck, car, motorcycle and bike tires, including bias, steel belted, and studded tires.

Not accepted: Tires with an inner diameter of 18.5 inches or larger.

Household Items

Fee: No charge

Must be clean and in good operating condition for resale by a charity. Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot use.

Accepted: Clothing, shoes, purses, bedding, linens, fabrics, games, toys, kitchenware, housewares, garden equipment, and hand tools.

Not accepted: Mattresses, books, carpeting, furniture, workstations, any wet, torn, soiled, broken, damaged, or incomplete items.

Televisions

Fee: \$15 per TV, up to 36 inches, encased in plastic; \$20 each for TVs larger than 36 inches, all wood consoles or sets encased in wood, and big screen TVs; \$30 each for projection-style TVs. **CASH ONLY.**

Accepted: Black & white or color TVs, working or not.

Electronics

Fee: No charge

Equipment can be working or non-working. Electronics will be recycled, not reconditioned or reused.

Accepted: Computers, cell phones, printers, keyboards, fax machines, photocopiers and scanners.

Not Accepted: Commercial equipment.

COMPUTER MONITORS

Fee: \$10 per unit, **CASH ONLY.**

Accepted: Any computer monitor, working or not working.

Concrete, Rock, Asphalt, Brick, (CRAB), Sinks & Toilets

Fee: \$5 per unit for each sink or toilet, **CASH ONLY.**

Please lay a tarp under CRAB for easy removal. Bring rocks and smaller concrete pieces in boxes or five-gallon buckets for ease of removal.

Accepted: Rock, brick, broken concrete, asphalt pavement, cinder blocks, toilets and sinks. Plastic, metal and wood must be removed.

Not Accepted: Asphalt shingles, gravel, crushed rock, and similar landscaping materials.

Items marked with ☠️ are household hazardous wastes and may be safely disposed through King County's Wastemobile program. CURBSIDE RECYCLING

If you're new to the neighborhood or new to recycling, signing up for curbside service is as easy as calling your garbage hauler. They will deliver recycling bins and provide weekly curbside recycling services. Yard waste pickup is also available. RESTRICTIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS

- These events are open to King County residents only.
- Cars, passenger vans and pick-ups only. Utility trailers up to 10 feet long may be used to haul items to the event.
- We reserve the right to refuse oversized loads or loads that appear to be commercial.
- No vehicles admitted after 3:00 P.M.
- Share the load with friends and neighbors to save energy and reduce congestion.
