


Location Map

King County

Items must meet the following guidelines. Some user fees apply to cover the cost of proper processing and recycling. All items collected will be recycled.

You can bring....

- **TIRES:** Bias ply, steel belted, and studded tires accepted. Limit 4 passenger tires per household (18 inches and below) free of charge. No tires on rims, large truck tires, or oversized tires accepted.
- **MOTOR OIL, FILTERS, & ANTIFREEZE:** Motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, brake fluid, transmission fluid, 2-cycle oil, steering fluid, crankcase oil, kerosene, and home heating fuel. Do not mix with antifreeze, solvents, gasoline, or other substances.
- **LEAD ACID BATTERIES:** Car, truck, marine, and motorcycle batteries accepted.
- **HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES:** AAAA, AAA, AA, A, B, C, and D cell batteries only.
- **CARDBOARD:** Please flatten. No wax coated cardboard.
- **HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND CLOTHING:** Includes clothing and miscellaneous household items in saleable condition. Mattresses will not be accepted. Furniture and items in need of repair will not be accepted.
- **PORCELAIN TOILETS AND SINKS:** Toilet seats, hardware, and base wax rings must be removed. **\$5 charge (cash only).**
- **BULKY WOOD:** Includes tree branches (minimum 6 inches in diameter), logs, clean wood, plywood, pallets, and other untreated and unpainted wood. No particle or press board. No leaves, grass, small branches, sod, brush, painted, or stained wood. *Please lay a tarp under material for ease of removal.*

- **PROPANE TANKS:** Residential tanks only. **\$5 charge (cash only).**
- **ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT:** Computers, printers, mouse, keyboards, fax machines, scanners and cell phones. Equipment will be recycled as metal. **Computer monitors will be collected for a \$10 charge (cash only). Electronic equipment is collected at the curb for Kirkland single family residents only.**
- **TELEVISION SETS:** TV sets with 36 inch or smaller screens and encased in plastic - **\$20 charge (cash only).** TV sets with larger than 36 inch screens, wood console, sets encased in wood, and big screen TV sets - **\$25 charge (cash only).** Projection TV sets - **\$30 charge (cash only).**

Household Hazardous Wastemobile

New Location

Household Hazardous Wastes can be taken to the Household Hazardous Wastemobile or one of three household hazardous waste collection sites.

The Household Wastemobile will visit the Kirkland area on March 10-12 (please note this is before the City recycling event on March 25, 2006). Hours are from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Location: Fred Meyer store located at 12221 120th Ave NE. Volume restrictions apply.

Don't Bring these Household Products:

- No scrap metal or appliances
- No construction/demolition debris
- No garbage
- No mattresses/furniture
- No plastic toys, hoses, etc.
- No window glass
- No painted wood



Don't Bring these Household Hazardous Wastes:

- No paint
- No pesticides/herbicides
- No solvents and thinners
- No household chemicals
- No cleaning products
- No fluorescent lights
