

Garden Recycling tips

- Modify and use for planting seedlings:
 - Egg cartons
 - Tetra-pak cartons (juice boxes)
 - Plastic bottles
 - Plastic containers for cherry tomatoes
 - Old boots and shoes
 - Plastic containers for take-out
 - The cardboard centers from toilet rolls
 - Plastic ice-cream containers
- Aluminum trays from pies make ideal 'drip saucers' to put under potted plants.
- Old tires can be used outside for plant pots - especially good for plants that like warm soil as they trap the heat.
- Broken crockery, styrofoam peanuts or plastic shopping bags can be used for drainage at the bottom of pots.
- Old newspapers can be used to mulch and weed control the garden. Wet newspaper and place thickly on the garden. Cover with bark or stones.
- Plastic milk bottles can be used to hold snail bait and are pet proof.
- Old stockings can be used to tie up/stake plants in the garden.



Use Less Stuff

To make a real impact on saving resources and energy, we must learn to not create so much waste in the first place, by reducing and reusing both products and packaging. 

⊘ NO propane tanks, air conditioners, car bodies or cans containing chemicals.

OIL, OIL FILTERS & ANTIFREEZE

Oil filters, motor oil, diesel fuel, kerosene, antifreeze, transmission & steering fluids.

⊘ DO NOT MIX. No gasoline or brake fluid accepted.

ALL BATTERIES

Household, automotive, marine, cell, aircraft, garden, batteries, etc.

Auto & motorcycle tires. Rims accepted. Max. tire diameter - 19.5"
