

Electronics Recycling Options

PLEASE NOTE:
Computers, monitors, laptops, and televisions will no longer be accepted at this event.
You may recycle these materials at NO CHARGE at designated E-Cycle Washington locations. Visit www.ecyclewashington.org or call 1-800-RECYCLE.

E-Cycle Washington is a new program created by electronics manufacturers to offer residents **FREE** and environmentally responsible recycling for their computers, computer monitors and televisions.

We encourage you to use E-Cycle Washington services. Please note that computer peripherals such as keyboards, mice, and printers are **not** included in the E-Cycle Washington program but will be accepted at this Recycling Collection Event.

Here's What You Can Bring:

Items must meet the following guidelines:


Item	Accepted	NOT Accepted	Notes
Bulky Wood Waste	Stumps, logs, and limbs at least 4 inches in diameter; pallets and clean, unpainted, untreated wood and plywood.	No tree debris less than 4 inches in diameter or larger than 3 feet in diameter. No twigs, small branches, brush, leaves, grass clippings, sod, soil, or painted, stained or treated wood, particle board, or sheet rock.	Please lay a tarp under wood debris for easy removal. Nails do not need to be removed.
Concrete, Rock, Asphalt, Brick, Sinks & Toilets	Rock, brick, broken concrete, asphalt pavement, cinder blocks, toilets and sinks.	No asphalt shingles, gravel, crushed rock, and similar landscaping materials. Concrete mix material must be removed from bags.	Fee: \$5 per unit for each sink or toilet, CASH ONLY. Please lay a tarp under concrete, rock, asphalt and bricks for easy removal. Rocks and smaller concrete pieces must be in boxes or five-gallon buckets for easy removal. Plastic, metal and wood must be removed.
Electronic Equipment	Cell phones, printers, keyboards, mice, fax machines, photo-copiers, scanners, stereos, VCRs and DVD players.	No commercial equipment.	 Equipment can be working or non-working. PLEASE NOTE: Computers, monitors, laptops, and televisions will no longer be accepted. You can recycle these items for FREE at other locations. See E-Cycle Washington tab for more information.
Household Items	Clothing, shoes, purses, bedding, linens, fabrics, books, games, toys, kitchenware, housewares, garden equipment, and hand tools.	No carpeting, furniture, workstations, any wet, torn, soiled, broken, damaged, or incomplete items.	Must be clean and in good operating condition for resale by a charity. Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot use.
 Mattresses	Mattresses, box springs and futons, any size.	No commercial loads. No furniture or frames. No wet or soiled items.	Fee: \$10 per mattress, box spring, or futon. Items must be dry and clean. Limit: 6 mattresses, box springs, or futons (combined total no more than 6). Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot recycle.
Refrigerators, Freezers, and Household Air Conditioners	Household refrigerators and freezers less than 4-by-6 foot, and household air conditioners.	No commercial appliances or automobile air conditioning units.	Fee: \$25 per unit, CASH ONLY. Other appliances accepted for free as scrap metal (see below).
Scrap Metal	Auto parts, engines and gas mowers (drained of oil and gas), metal lawn chairs, stoves, microwaves, hot water tanks, washers, dryers, cast iron sinks and tubs, swing sets, BBQ's, iron, steel, and other similar metals.	No car bodies, trailers, fluorescent light ballasts or items containing fluids.	Please remove any fluids, rubber, plastic, vinyl, webbing, and wheels.
 Styrofoam Blocks and Packing Peanuts	White styrofoam blocks. Packing peanuts (any color).	No urethane foam cushions, hot tub covers, expanded polypropylene or foam insulation.	Blocks: Expanded polystyrene only. Look for the #6 or EPS inside the recycling symbol. Packing peanuts: Please keep in a box or bag. All materials must be clean and dry.
Tires	Light truck, car, motorcycle, and bike tires, including bias, steel belted, and studded tires.	No tires with an inner diameter of 18.5 inches or larger.	Fee: Up to 8 tires off rim - no charge; \$3.00 each for all tires on rim. More than 8 tires: \$4.50 each on rim; \$1.50 each off rim. CASH ONLY.

All Fees Payable By Cash Only.

Please DON'T Bring:

These Household Wastes:

- No paint of any kind *
- No plastics
- No garbage and trash
- No window glass
- No broken or soiled items



These items may be disposed or recycled at other locations in the county. For more information, call King County at 206-296-4466, Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. or visit www.kingcounty.gov/WhatDoIDoWith.

These Hazardous Wastes:

- No propane tanks
- No oil-based paints / thinners / solvents
- No pesticides
- No cleaning products
- No antifreeze, oil or other automotive products
- No aerosol cans
- No batteries

Most of these hazardous wastes can be taken to the Household Hazardous Wastemobile or one of four household hazardous waste collection sites, including the Auburn Supermall (northwest corner of mall at 101 SuperMall Way). * Latex paint is no longer considered hazardous waste.

Curbside Recycling

If you're new to the neighborhood or new to recycling, signing up for curbside service is as easy as calling your garbage hauler. They will deliver recycling bins and provide curbside recycling services. Contact information for your hauler can be found at www.kingcounty.gov/solidwaste.

Restrictions and Recommendations

- These events are open to King County households only.
- Businesses or commercial loads will NOT be accepted. Businesses can visit www.kingcounty.gov/WhatDoIDoWith for information on recycling options. We reserve the right to refuse oversized loads or loads that appear to be commercial.
- Cars, passenger vans and pick-ups only. Utility trailers up to 10 feet long may be used to haul items to the event.
- Service providers have no obligation to collect any hazardous or other materials that do not conform to the specific descriptions and restrictions listed in this brochure.
